New Village Board, New Mayor Take Office

Michael Lever and Susan Shapiro joined the East Nassau Village Board this past April joining incumbents Tom Kernan and Lydia Davis.

Michael Lever won a write-in campaign replacing Bill Davis who decided not to seek another term. Long time trustee Adam Acquario won the mayor's job replacing long time trustee and mayor Mitch Levinn, who also opted not to seek another term.

In one of his first acts as mayor, Acquario appointed Susan Shapiro to

fill out the remainder of his term (one year).

The Village is in the process of reviewing the Land Use Regulations, the last time they were revised was 2010. "This has been an active process for close to a year," Mayor Acquario said, "And is really due to the great effort of former Mayor Levinn."

All changes to the village land use regulations will be put before the public before they are enacted into law.

East Nassau Village Budget

We have continued with our strategy of using state highway funding to fund our capital improvement projects (paved roads). That leaves our other main funding streams – state aid, county sales and mortgage taxes, and village property tax – to pay for our “regular operations” including road maintenance. This strategy has kept our finances in check while providing gradual, affordable upgrades to our infrastructure and services.

The recently enacted budget has no increase in our tax rate (\$1.77/\$1,000). The tax rate has stayed the same or gone down every year this decade.

The net effect is that living in the village saves taxpayers \$1.57 per \$1,000 in assessed valuation or over \$230 for a property assessed at \$150,000

Village Roadway Upgrades Planned



DPW Supervisor Michael Dorr has been doing an outstanding job managing our highway budget and

using state funds efficiently to upgrade our village roads.

This year we hope to “chip seal” Woodard Road (between Rt. 66 and Garfield) and Bath Township Road (off of Tsatsawassa Lake Road). “Whether we are able to get both done will depend on the estimates we receive for material. Regardless, we expect all work to be completed by the end of August,” said Dorr.
